Don't miss!

- Durham Cathedral is the final resting place of three of the most important Saints in Britain: Cuthbert, Bede and Oswald. The Treasures of St Cuthbert can be seen in our Museum housed within the 14th century monastic kitchen along with a rotating special exhibition.

Interesting local facts

- Completed in just 40 years between 1093-1133 Durham has been an active site of worship since the body of St Cuthbert arrived here in 995. Today the Cathedral continues to welcome hundreds of thousands of visitors each year.
